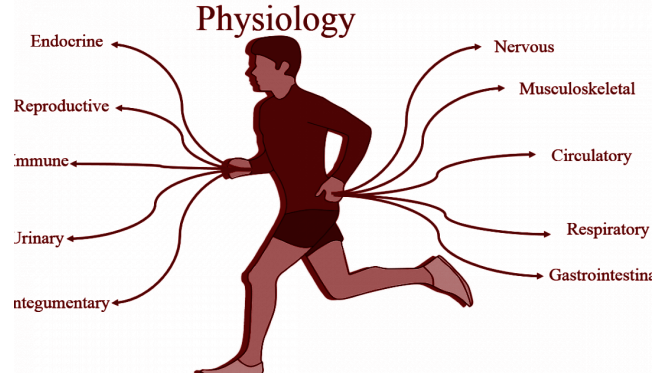

Summary

The FREEdom School is a new tuition free, private (independent) micro-school opening on September 11, 2023. We will serve 30 9th grade students in Year 1.

At The FREEdom School we hold four sacred values:

1. Revolutionary Love
2. Sacred Identity
3. Self and Community Determination
4. Putting In Work

We see young people as Warriors, Healers, Scholars and Hustlers and are looking for adults that can uphold our values and see young people in this way as well. To explore what we mean and what we stand for please check out our website: www.HomiesHighSchool.org

The FREEdom School is looking for an engaging, well-prepared, caring Physiology teacher who not only cares about the subject, but most importantly, cares about their students, and their ability to master the concepts being taught in applied physiology, in particular the healing sciences from Indigenous perspectives.

We are looking for a physiology teacher that has a willingness to be with the 9th grade cohort not only the entire year, but also a desire to help develop and grow The FREEdom School. We are preparing ourselves to make a 4-year commitment to these students to see them through graduation and beyond.

The position is currently part-time working with 30 founding 9th graders, 15 at a time, at The FREEdom School which is a new school opening up on September 11, 2023.

The class would be taught on Tuesdays from 1-2pm and then again from 2:15-3:15pm. It is a 1-hour integrated physiology course that can incorporate concepts from biology and other sciences that will be covered throughout the week.

It is not science for science's sake, but rather a scientific look at our bodies, at life. For example, in the 1st quarter students might make a model home utilizing applied science and applied mathematics to design it. With that project you might design the kind of living environment that you need to be in harmony with the elements for your and your community's well-being.

You would get to decide that together at the Teacher's Institute which takes place from September 1st-8th, 2023.

A physiology teacher of course focuses on physiology. However, in addition to applying a critical pedagogy of applied physiology content to make physiology accessible, relevant, and meaningful, a physiology teacher at The FREEdom School:

1. **Expresses Care:** Be dependable, Listen, Believe in students, Be warm and Encourage
2. **Challenges Growth:** Expect the best in students, Stretch students to go further, Hold students accountable in a good way, Help students reflect on mistakes and setbacks
3. **Provides Support:** Help students navigate through hard situations and systems, Advocate for students when they need it, Build confidence so students can take charge of their life, Set Boundaries that will keep students on track
4. **Shares Power:** Respect students, take them seriously and treat them fairly or at times with equity, Collaborate, Include students in decisions that affect them, Let students lead
5. **Expands Possibilities:** Inspire students to see possibilities for their future, Connect students to others that can help them grow, Broaden horizons by exposing students to new ideas, experiences and places

These 5 developmental relationships framework is borrowed from the "Search Institute."

Compensation and Expected Hours of Commitment

This is an hourly, part-time position.

The position is paid at \$50 per hour.

10 Hours:

- Tuesdays, 12:30pm-3:30pm (3 hours)
- Wednesdays, 2:00pm-5:00pm (3 hours)
- Prep Time: (4 hours)

Lead instruction on physiology, acupuncture and the science of healing. Lead two separate 1-hour learning sessions every week on Thursdays for 15 students each.

Hours

Tuesdays, 12:30pm-3:30pm (3 hours)

Wednesdays, 2:00pm-5:00pm (3 hours)

- Staff Meeting (1-1.5 hours),
- Collaboration Time (1-1.5 hours)

4 hours: Prep your lessons, review work (at your chosen time)

Compensation

The position is part-time, paid at \$50 per hour, 30-weeks

10 hours per week x \$50 per hour: \$500 per week

10 hours x \$50 x 30 weeks: \$15,000

Approximately: \$2,000 (before taxes) per month

The class is broken down into two quarters.

Each quarter begins slowly by design with a teacher's institute to give you time to plan out the quarter along with a welcome week to get to know the students and build rapport.

Minimum Qualifications

1. Strong grasp of physiology.
2. Proven ability to scaffold learning experiences in physiology so that students can excel in these concepts.
3. Lots of patience for students who may have a real difficult relationship with science.
4. A strong collaborative spirit to work with the ethnic studies and other science teachers to co-plan project based learning experiences that are meaningful for young people.

The Ideal Candidate works hard to prepare, doesn't come on time, but early, is willing to support students at all stages of their development. They have a deep understanding of East Oakland and may mirror the lived experiences of the young people that they will build with.
